Happy Sabbath! Shabbat Shalom!

A warm welcome to our Holy Communion Sabbath! As we partake in this sacred ordinance, may we reflect upon Jesus Christ's ultimate sacrifice of ove and grace. This special time of fellowship, humility, and renewal invites us to draw closer to our Savior and to one another. Let us open our hearts to His presence, be refreshed by the Holy Spirit, and stand united in faith as we watchfully await Christ's Second Advent.

Pr. Sammy Williams Aloo will break the bread of life. He has a message titled: "Think Big, Pray Big". As we reflect on God's Love, let us pray for Pr. Aloo and all those ministering today, asking for God's guidance, blessings, and inspiration as they lead us in worship.

PASTORAL MESSAGE: "HUMILITY IN SERVICE!"

Simon Peter said to Him, "Lord, not my feet only, but also my hands and my head!" Jesus said to him, "He who is bathed needs only to wash his feet, but is completely clean; and you are clean, but not all of you." (John 13:9-10 NKJV)

Peter's response is an appeal for Jesus to not only wash his feet, but his head and hands, as well. Peter seems to understand that this foot-washing has a spiritual meaning. Whatever benefit Jesus is imparting, he wants as much of it as possible. A mention of the hands is often symbolic of work or effort. The head is the center of one's thinking. If Jesus is offering divine "cleansing," Peter sincerely wants that to apply to his behavior and his thoughts.

After objecting to the idea of Jesus washing his feet, Peter is told he has no choice. He responds by asking Jesus to cleanse his feet, head, and hands (John 13:6-9). That all but proves Peter understands that Jesus is setting up a spiritual lesson. As Jesus and Peter discussed washing of feet, they have used the Greek root word nipto. Here, when Jesus refers to "bathing," He uses the word louō. The difference between these two terms is almost exactly the same as between the English words "wash" and "bathe." One implies a spot-cleaning action, the other an all-over deep clean. Also noteworthy is that Jesus uses a form of louō that's past-tense, while nipto is a continuing action. The one who is bathed is "completely clean," despite needing to have their feet routinely washed. Being rebathed is unnecessary.

The symbolism of that remark crystalizes when Jesus completes the statement: "you (Peter) are (bathed) clean, but not every one of you (who are here are bathed clean).

These words mean more than bodily cleanliness. Christ is still speaking of the higher cleansing as illustrated by the lower. He who came from the bath was clean, but the sandaled feet soon became dusty, and again needed to be washed. So Peter and his brethren had been washed in the great fountain opened sin and uncleanness. acknowledged them as His. But temptation had led them into evil, and they still needed His cleansing grace. When Jesus girded Himself with a towel to wash the dust from their feet, He desired by that very act to wash the alienation, jealousy, and pride from their hearts. This was of far more consequence than the washing of their dusty feet. With the spirit they then had, not one of them was prepared for communion with Christ. Until brought into a state of humility and love, they were not prepared to partake of the paschal supper, or to share in the memorial service which Christ was about to institute. Their hearts must be cleansed. Pride and self-seeking create dissension and hatred, but all this Jesus washed away in washing their feet. A change of feeling was brought about. Looking upon them, Jesus could say, "Ye are clean." Now there was union of heart, love for one another. They had become humble and teachable`.
