A warm welcome to the International Women's Day of Prayer and the Adventist Women's Ministries (AWM) Sabbath. We are delighted to have you join in celebrating this special Sabbath. Our speaker today is Sis. Gladys Gakinderu. Gladys is the Prayer Ministries Leader and former AWM Leader. She is married to Eld. Nehemiah Njuguna and together they are blessed with 2 boys. We welcome and pray for her as she prepares to speak on the subject, "Reach Out", inspired by Mark 5:22-24.

As we celebrate this annual event and reflect on God's love and the vital role women play in "reaching out" to God's children as "disciples of Jesus Christ and members of His world church", let us lift in prayer Sis. Gladys, singing groups, and all those ministering today. May God guide, bless, and inspire them as they lead us in worship.

PASTORAL MESSAGE: "A WOMAN OF FAITH"

He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering." (Mark 5:34, NKJV)

The woman with an issue of blood reached out to Jesus' cloak for healing, but did so secretly, in fear she would be humiliated and shamed or that she would disgrace Jesus with her touch.. The Jews saw personal tragedy and illness as a reaction from God for personal sinfulness. The woman is destitute and most likely in pain because of her disease (Mark 5:26). But to add insult to injury, she has also spent the last twelve years unclean, unable to go to the temple or even be around other people without passing her uncleanness to them. Jesus does not shame her. Instead, He gives her more gifts than she could have imagined.

First, Jesus calls her "daughter." She is the only person in the New Testament to be called daughter by Jesus. Moments before, a respected synagogue leader had prostrated himself before Jesus, begging Him to save his deathly ill daughter. This woman apparently has no champion to speak for her. So, Jesus stops what He is doing and takes the time to make sure she realizes: He is her champion. She is now under His care and protection. He will not cheat her like the "healers" who pointlessly took her money (Mark 5:26). He will not abase her, like she expects. He will claim her as His own.

Next, He affirms and commends her faith to the crowd. We don't know how much of her confidence in Jesus' power was tainted by pagan magical beliefs, but Jesus doesn't care. Her faith might not have been

perfect, but it was aimed at the right target: God and His promises. She sees Jesus, she knows she needs Him, and she has the boldness to claim Him.

Although the woman is healed—she feels it in her body (Mark 5:29)—Jesus relieves her of the burden of having to prove her health. He announces it to the crowd so that everyone will know. He also uses her as an example. Many people are pushing Him, trying to touch Him and receive healing. Jesus clearly states that it is the woman's faith that healed her, not her touch.

The woman with the issue of blood shows us that no matter what we need healing from, Jesus is not ashamed to respond. The length of our suffering, the social pariah we may have become because of it, the indignity of our physical condition—Jesus doesn't care. He may not heal us physically, but if we reach out to Him in faith, He is always willing to claim us as His own.

'A longing soul had reached out to Him for help which no one but He could give. Jesus said, "I perceive that virtue is gone out of me." And he looked round about to see her that had done this thing," and when the woman knew she was not hid, she acknowledged the good work that had been wrought in her. She told the story of her suffering and her hopeless condition, and her act of faith in touching His garment. He said unto her, "Daughter, thy faith hath made thee whole." — {The Signs of the Times, June 10, 1889}.

This woman's story can inspire us during difficult situations in our lives.

"The faith that is unto salvation is not a mere intellectual assent to the truth. He who waits for entire knowledge before he will exercise faith, cannot receive blessing from God. It is not enough to believe about Christ; we must believe in Him. The only faith that will benefit us is that which embraces Him as a personal Savior; which appropriates His merits to ourselves. Many hold faith as an opinion. Saving faith is a transaction by which those who receive Christ join themselves in covenant relation with God. Genuine faith is life. A living faith means an increase of vigor, a confiding trust, by which the soul becomes a conquering power." {The Desire of Ages, page 347, paragraph 1}.

May this Sabbath be a time of **renewal**, **reflection**, and **revival**. Welcome, and be blessed!

Adventist Women's Ministries Today

What it is ...

Women's Ministries is a place to address the <u>spiritual</u>, <u>emotional</u>, <u>physical</u>, and <u>social needs</u> of women in the church.

- Adventist Women's Ministries encourages women to improve their potential for participation in the mission of the church.
- It is a support system for women who are hurting—whether they are suffering from divorce, abuse or simply loneliness.
- It is a forum to help address topics and issues as they affect the woman.
- It encourages young women through a scholarship program.
- It encourages women to become involved in all areas of ministry in their church, their community, and in their home.
- It mentors young women so that they may find joy in the Lord.
- Women's Ministries recognizes that women have many Gifts of the Spirit, and it attempts to help women discover and use these gifts to the glory of God.

What it isn't ...

Women's Ministries is not new. In 1898 Mrs. S.M.I. Henry, with the encouragement of Ellen G. White, headed a church department for women's ministry. Soon afterwards her death ended the work she began. It wasn't until 1990 that the Office of Women's Ministries was once again began to function. It became a full church department in 1995.

- Adventist Women's Ministries is not a forum for women who have complaints, justified or not, against employers.
- It is not a place for women to promote equal rights for women, although we admit it is an important issue.
- It is not a mere source of entertainment or the opportunity to spend endless hours on projects that merely promote selfish ideas.
- It is not a platform for the ordination of women, although we believe that everyone should use their talents to God's glory and should receive just recognition for work done for His honor.
- It is not male bashing. It is anti-sexist, not anti-male.
- AWM is not exclusive. It wants inclusion, not the exclusion of anyone.
