# Happy Sabbath! Shabbat Shalom!

Awarm welcome to the Children Ministry Sabbath. We are blessed to have you worship with us. Our speaker is Bro. Mark Sultan Gersava, a dedicated servant of God from the Philippines.

Bro. Mark has served as an Adventist Youth leader for about 15 years. He is the first Seventh-day Adventist to receive the Outstanding Young Men of the Philippines award, awarded as Leader for Innovation by the Royal Academy of Engineering in London, United Kingdom, Entrepreneur of the Year: Circle of Excellence by Asia CEO Awards, Start upper of the Year in Paris, France, among other awards.

In recognition of his outstanding work in sustainable innovation, he was appointed by President Ferdinand "Bongbong" Marcos Jr. as the youngest Executive Cabinet Member of the National Innovation Council, making him the first Adventist to hold a Cabinet-level position in the Philippine government.

He is also the founder of BAMBUHAY, a faith-driven social enterprise with a mission to save the planet and save lives—God's ultimate innovation.

We welcome and pray for him as he prepares to speak on the subject "Living a Purpose-Driven Life in the Age of AI". The message is inspired by Prov. 19:11.

Please lift in prayer Bro. Mark and all those ministering today. May God guide, bless, and inspire them as they lead us in worship.

# Pastoral Message: "Training Up a Child"

Sis. Ellen G. White, wrote extensively on the moral, spiritual, and physical wellbeing of children and how society can negatively influence them. She warned against various influences that she believed could place children at risk.

Today is the World Day of Prayer for children at risk and here are key highlights from the pen of inspiration:

#### 1. Unwholesome Literature and Entertainment

Sis. White warned against exposing children to harmful literature, fiction, and entertainment, including novels, sensational stories, movies and amusements. She believed these could corrupt morals and distract from spiritual growth. These take

quality time with God away from our children. "The reading of fiction excites the imagination, unfits the mind for usefulness, and disqualifies it for spiritual exercise." — {Counsels to Parents, Teachers, and Students, p. 135}

**Prayer point:** Jesus, we pray for unrushed, meaningful time with You and our children. Amen.

#### 2. Lack of Parental Guidance

White emphasized the responsibility of parents to guide, discipline, and protect their children from negative influences from all directions. "Too much importance cannot be placed upon the early training of children. The lessons learned, the habits formed, during the years of infancy and childhood have more to do with the formation of the character and the direction of the life than have all the instruction and training of after years." — {Ministry of Healing, p. 380}

**Prayer point:** Lord Jesus, help us to train our children to know and understand your love against all risk they are prone to and protect them at all costs. Amen

# 3. Negative Peer Influence

The pen of inspiration warned about allowing children to associate too freely with other children or youth who do not have a good godly influence. "Children are in danger of associating with evil companions, and parents should guard them carefully." — {Child Guidance, p. 114}

**Prayer point:** Dear Jesus, social associations come with high risk of negative influence. We pray that our children embrace only goodness of social capital in your Holy name. Amen

#### 4. Idleness and Lack of Purpose

Sis. White stressed the dangers of idleness and the need for children to be engaged in meaningful work, learning, and spiritual development. "Idleness is the greatest curse that can fall upon man, for vice and crime follow in its train." — *{Fundamentals of Christian Education, p. 145}* 

**Prayer point:** Lord Jesus, idleness is the devil's workshop. Please come now, occupy our mind, hands, and speech. Amen

Let's continue to lift our children who are at risk. God bless you!


