Pastoral Message: "Bear much Fruit"

"By this My Father is glorified, that you bear much fruit; so you will be My disciples." – John 15:8, NKJV

Today is a high Sabbath. We shall witness and celebrate baptism of and renewal of many souls. The pen of inspiration placed tremendous value on spiritual education and the integration of faith and learning. Ellen G. White emphasized that teachers and ministers must work together for the salvation of young people.

Today we witness the fruit of such collaboration under these themes:

- 1. Teachers as Spiritual Guardians: "The true teacher is not satisfied with second-rate work. He is not satisfied with directing his students to a standard lower than the highest which it is possible for them to attain. He cannot be content with imparting to them only technical knowledge, with making them merely clever skillful accountants, artisans, successful tradesmen. It is his ambition to inspire them with principles of truth, obedience, honor, integrity, and purity—principles that will make them a positive force for the stability and uplifting of society. He desires them, above all else, to learn life's great lesson of unselfish service. {Education, p. 29}
- The Elders, Ministers and Schools Working Together: "There should be companies organized and educated most thoroughly to work as nurses, as evangelists, as ministers, as canvassers, as gospel students, to perfect a character after the divine similitude. To prepare to receive the higher education in the school

above is now to be our purpose...." — {A Call to Medical Evangelism and Health Education, p. 29}


We are saved to serve as chaplains along these themes:

- Spiritual Ministry in Hospitals and Prisons: "When the sick come to our institutions, they should be made to realize that there is a divine power at work, that angels of God are present."— {Manuscript 57, 1909}
- Pastoral Care for the Sick and Troubled: "The tender sympathies of our Saviour were aroused for fallen and suffering humanity. If you would be His followers, you must cultivate compassion and sympathy." — *{Counsels on Health, p. 34}*
- 3. **Ministry to Soldiers and Prisoners:** "The followers of Christ should value souls as He valued them. Their sympathies should be with the work of their dear Redeemer, and they should labor to save the purchase of His blood, at any sacrifice. What are money, houses, and lands in comparison with even one soul?" {*Lift Him Up, p. 242*}
