### Happy Sabbath! Shabbat Shalom!

We warmly welcome you to the Music Sabbath. We are blessed to have you worship with us today. Our speaker is Bro. Andrew Owino. He will share the Word under the theme: "A Song of Substance", inspired by Psalm 96:1–4.

#### PASTORAL MESSAGE: "SACRED MUSIC"

According to Ellen G. White, music is a sacred gift from God—an essential means of worship, spiritual growth, and communion with the divine. She describes music as having the power to uplift, purify, and elevate the soul when used rightly, while warning against its misuse for self-glorification or worldly pleasure. As Scripture declares, "Sing to the Lord, all the earth; proclaim the good news of His salvation from day to day" (1 Chronicles 16:23, NKJV). Music, then, becomes a powerful channel for expressing reverence, gratitude, and devotion to God.

In the Seventh-day Adventist tradition, sacred music is far more than art—it is a ministry of the soul. It prepares hearts to receive God's Word, teaches biblical truths, and reflects His holiness and order. Ellen White emphasized that music in worship must be reverent, not driven by performance or emotional excess. "Let the word of Christ dwell in you richly in all wisdom, teaching and admonishing one another in psalms and hymns and spiritual songs, singing with grace in your hearts to the Lord" (Colossians 3:16, NKJV). Through such music, hearts are drawn heavenward and faith is deepened.

Furthermore, sacred music promotes unity across the global Adventist Church, offering a shared voice of hope and praise across languages and cultures. It gives a glimpse of the eternal worship in heaven, where the redeemed sing before God's throne. "Praise the Lord with the harp; make melody to Him with an instrument of ten strings. Sing to Him a new song; play skillfully with a shout of joy" (Psalm 33:2–3, NKJV). For Ellen White, sacred music is both a safeguard against worldliness and a divine gift preparing believers to join the heavenly choir.

#### **LOSS AND GRIEF**

Support Systems in Times of Grief: The Role of the Church Community

Grief is one of the most profound and personal experiences a human can endure. Whether it stems from the loss of a loved one, a relationship, health, or a life dream, the pain can feel isolating and overwhelming. In such times, one of the most powerful tools for healing is community support—and in particular, the compassionate embrace of the church congregation.

#### 1. God Created Us for Community

- Being surrounded by a caring and understanding community helps to:
- Affirm their humanity and emotions.
- Counteract isolation that often accompanies loss.
- Serve as the hands and feet of Christ, offering tangible love and support.

### 2. What Congregational Support Looks Like

A grieving person often won't say what they need, and sometimes, they don't know themselves. As a church, we are called to step into that silence with compassion. Some practical ways the church can support grieving members include:

- a. Presence Over Words
- b. Prayer and Spiritual Encouragement
- c. Practical Help

Provide meals for the grieving family.

Help with household chores or errands.

Offer transport or companionship for appointments or church events.

- d. Grief Support Groups and Counseling
- e. Long-Term Care

Grief doesn't end after the funeral. Often, the pain intensifies in the weeks and months that follow.
